Message

Mike and I completed the transition at a dinner on May 30 at Keystone Pub (great place on Grape Street), along with Club Member Ron Paret and our Spouses (from Left) Donna, MaryAnn, and Cindy. The official turnover of the "LV BEEMER LOCKBOX" is now complete.

As in-coming president, my goals are simple:

- Grow Member Engagement / Increase Social Activities
- Share experiences /ride training opportunities to improve riding skills / safety
- Improve Club Communications/Coordination through a website presence or other Applications (for example, MEETUP).
- Increase Club Riding Opportunities (Day Trips, Overnight Trips, Long Distance Trips)

To Grow Membership, I recently reached out to BMWMOA Members in the Lehigh Valley area, and about 15 MOA members 'connected' with me on the MOA website. They received the May 29 email with the invitation to join the club.

I also sent the invitation out to the 40 or so current members on our club membership list to confirm who wishes to continue with the club going forward. *NOTE: please ensure that if you want to continue with the club complete the attached form and submit the membership fee to me by June 18.*

Lastly, I will be working with Ted Moyer, BMWMOA Executive Director and coordinator of membership to identify more potential MOA members in the area and invite them to join. I expect to meet with Ted via ZOOM or TEAMS in early June.

To develop a website, I've reached out to Ted Moyer and have been reviewing how other BMW Clubs do it. MOA now assists clubs in creating websites to manage club activities. As I meet with Ted on membership, I will get plugged into the website development actions needed. At this point, if any new club members have web development experience, and wish to volunteer to assist in this effort, please contact me! Also, if you have any other ideas on communication and ride tools, please let me know.

On the rider safety training front, up until several years ago I would take the MSF Advanced Rider Course (ARC) annually at a local training location to bone-up on riding skills on one of

my bikes after sparse winter riding. Unfortunately, Pennsylvania dropped the previous training provider and no longer offers the ARC. I want to research this more and give club members more information on training/retraining opportunities to improve their riding skills and ultimately their safety. We also want to hold periodic seminars on safety topics and riding situations. We are fortunate to have David Dunn in our Club - who was recently chosen to be a member of the BMWMOA Foundation Board of Directors. I will be discussing this subject further with David to bring safety information/training to club members. We are committed to rider safety.

After working as an investment banker, owning several businesses, and doing small business development, is ready to retire and help the foundation advance its goal of 'training every rider'. While he currently works in Economic Development and co-runs a manufacturing incubator in Allentown, PA, he is eager to be in saddle and on the road - as much as possible.

David and his wife Vikki have three grown children and one granddaughter. David has been riding motorcycles since college except for a 15year break while raising his kids. He came back

to riding in 2004, while living in Vermont, when he purchased an 02 RT and joined the MOA.

David has served on many non-profit Boards and was elected multiple times to run/chair a large school board. He has donated his time toward helping many charities from United Way to Habitat. He is also a Paramedic (13 years) and now teaches EMT's in the Lehigh Valley.

David currently rides a 2015 K1600GT and enjoys the open road. He loves long distance touring, motorcycle camping and splitting his time between riding and working EMS at rallies. 'I am really looking forward to building the Foundation into a self-sustaining organization that supports rider safety, education and training. One day, I hope every rider is trained.'

Lastly, we all bought motorcycles so we can ride. I've found that riding with others with the same passion for riding is more fun than riding alone. I can do it, but prefer the crowd. So, I will work with our ride coordinators to schedule and lead rides. My goal is to create a database of rides – by collecting/creating GPX files so that we can take the ride now, or anytime in the future. And, if you cannot attend a ride, pull the GPX file off the website and take the ride yourself when you have the time. Think DVR for rides. I will be coordinating with Bruce McKelvy - our BMWMOA Regional Coordinator to work other local chapter presidents to share their ride GPX Files, and share ours as well. I will also schedule cross-club rides.

As you know, I've re-instituted annual dues for the club. The purpose of this is to increase social gatherings and to fund activities for a website and other apps to improve club communications / coordination of rides / social activities. In bouncing this off several members, we settled on an annual dues amount of \$25 for a member including spouse for this first year. We will account for the funds through our treasurer periodically and adjust this fee going forward based on our spend through the year. I will keep you informed of this as we go.
