President's Message

Dear LV Beemers Club Members,

Spring has Sprung. I am excited to get riding again after my self-imposed hiatus since November. I am sure we all are. One thing to keep in mind as we venture forth maybe for the first time in months >> ensure you ride within your abilities as you again become accustomed to riding and interaction with traffic and the road.

Speaking of safe riding, for some time I've been meaning to share info on the BRAKEFREE unit I bought last spring. The February 2022 BMWMOA Owner News has an article about it. It's an accelerometer and gyrobased super-bright braking light that you can secure to the rear of your helmet. It is so bright and annoying when you brake, I've had other riders ask me to ride sweep in a group. It makes you very visible from behind (maximum 'conspicuity' as the article states...twice) – even in bright daylight. I'm a believer that making yourself visible reduces your risk – from the front, sides, and back. Consider one. Most people I've talked to are concerned about the additional weight on the helmet (7 ounces). In my opinion – I haven't noticed the additional weight and have no neck soreness after riding a full day. And it can be swapped helmet to helmet easily with the multiple mounts provided. Here is the website.

The Endowment was discussed in the Special MOA Foundation Issue of the February 2022 BMWMOA Owner News. - Use 'AmazonSmile' when you buy products through Amazon. Through the AmazonSmile program, Amazon will donate 0.5% of eligible purchases to the charity of your choice 'MOA Foundation'. See page 18 of the February MOA 'ON' for details on how to do this. I had never heard that Amazon had this program. I signed up and now the MOA Foundation will receive contributions from my Amazon purchases going forward. One hitch you must sign up 3x per year (every 4 months) to continue the program.

I continue to work with David Dunn, Mark Pederson, and Bob Spine of the Skylands Club to review available training courses and inform club members about them. Here's what we have so far:

a. PA DMV Offers American Motorcycle Training (AMT) Training - ARC

b. BMWMOA Foundation Training Information

From Otoole's Barn: 'The Pace'

A couple of riders in the club use 'The Pace' when riding alone or in group rides. I've used it for several years with some riding friends.

If you've not heard of The Pace, it came out of an article in Motorcyclist magazine in 1991. Nick lenatsch and Mitch Boehm 'invented' the Pace while working at Motorcyclist Magazine. Many people have adopted it. I recommend we 'consciously' adopt it. While we learned some of these tips in 'basic training' years ago, it warrants a re-review and conscious practice with fellow rider 'peer checks' to make it 'muscle memory'.

It's about maximizing safety while still having fun on the twisties. The key is appropriate curve entry speed (with minimal braking) and forceful countersteering (not leaning your body into the turn), and then rolling onto the throttle before the apex and smoothly transitioning out of the curve at a spirited pace into the straightaway.

From the article...... "The Pace focuses on bike control and de-emphasizes outright speed. Full-throttle acceleration and last-minute braking aren't part of the program, effectively eliminating the two most common single-bike accident scenarios in sport riding."
